Year 6 Curriculum Map

Spring 2

Maths In maths, we will be completing the areas we haven't yet covered, which include geometry, position & direction, and graphs & averages. The children will also be practising and refining their arithmetic skills through weekly arithmetic tests.	English Our text for this half term is 'Rose Blanche' by Ian McEwan. The children will be exploring the text, and gaining experience in writing descriptive narratives, scripts and persuasive writing. In grammar they will be learning how to use hyphens as well as revisiting previous Year 6 knowledge.	RE In RE, our title is, 'Why do Christians celebrate the Eucharist?' During this unit we will identify the links between the Passover meal, Last Supper and Eucharist. We will develop our understanding of the Eucharist and the symbolism connected with it and why it is celebrated.
History In history we will learn all about World War II, where it took place and who it was fought between. The children will also learn about what happened during the Battle of Britain and the Blitz and understand the significant role that Bletchley Park played in helping the Allied Powers win the war.	Geography In Geography, we will be finishing our North America unit and then learning all about the continent South America and the varying countries within it. The children will learn about the Amazon rainforest and the effects of deforestation. They will also learn about are the longest mountain range in the world, the Andes.	Computing Programming - variables in games We will be creating a game with a simulation scoreboard using Scratch. Data and information - spreadsheets We will be learning more about spreadsheets and how to use them efficiently to plan events and answer questions.
PE In P.E we will be swimming this half term. The children will be developing their techniques in swimming, as well as learning vital life-saving skills.	Art We will be studying Impressionism and Post-Impressionism, and artists such as Monet, Renoir and Van Gogh. The children will be using media such as paint, chalk, charcoal and collage to create artwork in the style of the artists studied.	PSHE Through our 'My Happy Mind' scheme, we will be covering the following modules: Appreciate - exploring the benefits of practising gratitude to our wellbeing Relate - looking at the importance of getting along with others in order to develop positive relationships This term we will also be covering some of our RSE curriculum on puberty.
Design Technology Food Technology - Seasonal Soups We will be researching which vegetables are in season and shopping for ingredients using a budget. We will be preparing and cooking soup, evaluating our products, writing recipes and designing packaging.
